Chapter 464.CHAP. 464.

An act additional to an act to incorporate the Heron Lake Dam Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The Heron Lake Dam Company shall have the right to demand and receive the sum of one dollar per thousand for each and every thousand feet, board measure, woods' scale, for all logs and timber which may pass over and through their dams, locks and works into Chamberlain lake, instead of the toll now allowed by law therefor, and for the security and collection of such toll, shall have the same lien on such logs and timber, and the same rights to sell the same as are provided for the toll now collectable in and by the act additional to said act of incorporation, approved August eleven, eighteen hundred and forty-eight; such right to demand and collect such toll of one dollar per thousand feet to remain in force until a sum sufficient, shall accrue from such tolls to pay all the expenses of rebuilding the dam recently carried away in part, with interest in addition to the expenses which may be incurred during the same, for keeping in repair the dams, locks and works of said company, and the dam at the outlet of Allegash lake, and the other ordinary expenses of the corporation, from and after the year in which with previous years such sufficient sums shall accrue as aforesaid, for the purposes aforesaid, all rights under this act shall cease, and the company shall thenceforward have all and the same rights as are now enjoyed by said company before this additional act is passed.

Toll established.

SECT. 2. In order to ascertain and determine the time when this act shall cease, as provided in the first section, the treasurer of said corporation shall annually on or before the first day of January in each year, make return to the land agent of the state, a true account of all sums of money paid or expended during the year previous, for the several purposes specified in the foregoing section, and also all sums due or collected for tolls during such year, and thereupon said land agent shall audit the said account, and his decision shall be conclusive of the amount so expended.

Treasurer of corporation shall make return of receipts and expenses to land agent.
