CHAP. 319.**Chapter 319.**

Resolve in favor of John Parrs and Margaret Webb.

John Parrs and

of.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to relinquish to John Parrs and Margaret Webb, of Portland, all the right, title and interest which the state now has in and to certain real estate in said Portland, viz., a certain piece of real estate, described as follows: beginning at the southerly corner of a lot of land Braxton Driver sold to Rebecca Johnson, as per his deed dated October ten, eighteen hundred thirty-three; thence southerly by the southwest-erly line of the lot Reuben Ruby purchased of Samuel Freeman, as will appear by said Freeman's deed recorded in the Cumberland registry of deeds, book one hundred six, page two hundred twenty-eight, forty feet to the rear of the meeting house lot, so called; thence northeasterly by said meeting house lot fifty feet to the easterly corner of the above named Johnson's lot; thence south-westerly by the said lot fifty feet to the first mentioned bounds, re-serving a passage way ten feet in width from the meeting house lot on the southwesterly side, being the estate of which one Braxton Driver died seized and possessed, and which has escheated to the state.

Chapter 320.

Resolve in favor of Lewey Tomer.

Resolved, That there be allowed to Lewey Tomer for injuries re-ceived while in the employ of the state, the sum of four dollars per month, during the pleasure of the legislature, to be paid to such person or persons, and in such sum or sums as the governor and council may determine, for the benefit of the said Tomer and his family, the annuity aforesaid to commence on the first day of Jan-uary, eighteen hundred and sixty.

Chapter 321.

Resolve in favor of Joshua Chamberlain.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to investigate the claim to a lot of land, under certificate to Elizabeth Coolidge granted by the state in pursuance of resolves entitled resolves in

favor of certain officers and soldiers of the revolutionary war, and the widows of deceased officers and soldiers, approved March seventeen, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five, and to convey to said Chamberlain the assignee one lot of two hundred acres from any lands lotted for settlement, unless said land agent shall find that said certificate can be located upon the townships contemplated in said resolve.

Chapter 322.

Resolve in favor of Maine State Agricultural Society.

Resolved, That there be paid out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, to the treasurer of the Maine State Agricultural Society the sum of two thousand and seven hundred dollars as remuneration for losses incurred at the last annual exhibition.

Chapter 323.

Resolve in favor of commissioners on state valuation.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the state treasury to James Erskine, Jonathan Russ, Daniel Pierce, R. S. Prescott, W. P. Hariman and L. G. Philbrook, commissioners on state valuation, the sum of forty dollars each in full for services rendered the committee on state valuation in pursuance of an order of the legislature passed February fourteen, eighteen hundred and sixty.

Resolve in favor of John Neptune.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state the sum of twenty-five dollars to John Neptune of the Penobscot tribe of Indians, as a salary for services as governor of said tribe.
