Chapter 362.

Resolve in favor of the town of Woodstock.

Resolved, That the secretary of state be directed to deliver to the clerk of the town of Woodstock, for the use of said town, all the books which towns are entitled by law to receive, those belonging to said town having been destroyed by fire; *provided* the same are in the state library.

Chapter 363.

Resolve relating to the witnesses before the committee on treasurer's accounts.

Resolved, That the governor and council be directed to audit all the claims of witnesses and others for travel and attendance before the committee on treasurer's accounts, and allow for travel, attendance and other expenses, such sum to each as may be reasonable, and draw their warrant for the sums allowed, and the treasurer is directed to pay the same.
