Chapter 372.

Resolve in favor of Josiah P. Bean.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury to Josiah P. Bean a pension of six dollars per month during his natural life, from and after the passage of this resolve, the same being for injuries received while in the service of the state.

Chapter 373.

Resolve in favor of Daniel Bunker.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the state treasury to Daniel Bunker, the sum of twenty-five dollars, being money paid to the state by said Bunker under misapprehension of law.

Chapter 374.

Resolve in favor of Medway plantation.

Resolved, That the state treasurer be authorized and directed to pay thirty-four dollars and ninety-six cents to the treasurer of Medway plantation, in exchange for a check on Norembege Bank dated August nineteenth, eighteen hundred and fifty-nine, for the same amount, it being for the amount of the school fund appropriated to said plantation for the year eighteen hundred and fifty-nine.
