Chapter 377.

Resolve in favor of the county of Androscoggin.

Resolved, That the secretary of state be authorized to furnish to Androscoggin the county of Androscoggin such copies of the acts and resolves favor of. of the state of former years, as he can furnish in the present condition of the library.

Chapter 378.

Resolve in favor of Penobscot tribe of Indians,

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of state four Penobscot hundred dollars, under the direction of the governor and council, Indians, in favor of. to be expended by the agent of the Penobscot tribe of Indians, for the purchase of seed and planting the same.

Chapter 379.

Resolve relating to the claims of the state against the sureties of B. D. Peck, late state treasurer.

Resolved, That James G. Blaine, George K. Jewett, Frederick Robie, James M. Stone, Roland Fisher, Joseph Porter and George Comstock be and hereby are appointed commissioners with authority to adjust with the sureties of B. D. Peck, late state treasurer, Peck. their liabilities on said Peck's official bonds, with full power to _powers, &c. settle and apportion the same on such terms and stipulations as shall be just and equitable; and upon adjustment by said sureties to discharge them. But if said sureties shall fail to comply with If not adjusted. the terms and stipulations fixed by said commissioners within sixty ...to report to days after notice thereof, they shall so report to the governor and governor and council.

council who shall take immediate measures to enforce collection of said bonds. And said commissioners shall have a meeting at Augusta and hear the parties immediately after the final adjournment of the legislature.

Chapter 380.

Resolve in favor of David Strout.

David Strout, in favor of.

Resolved, That there be paid to David Strout of Poland, from the treasury of the state, the sum of four dollars per month, during the pleasure of the legislature, commencing on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and sixty, it being for injuries received while doing military duty in the service of the state, in the year eighteen eighteen hundred and thirty-nine.

Chapter 381.

Resolve for locating and opening in part a road from the Eastern Aroostook to Fish River road.

Road from Eastern Aroostook to Fish river road, in favor of. Resolved, That the sum of six hundred dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated to be expended under the direction of the land agent in locating and opening a road through township number fourteen, range four, west from the east line of the state, beginning at the terminus of a road located by Lore Alford, in eighteen hundred fifty-nine, through township number fourteen, range three.

Chapter 382.

Resolve authorizing the governor to appoint a chaplain to the state prison.

Chaplain of state prison, appointment of.

Resolved, That the governor by and with the advice and consent of the executive council is hereby authorized to appoint a resident chaplain at the state prison with such salary as he may deem reasonable.
