#### Chapter 1.

An act to make valid the doings of the inhabitants of the town of Lee, in the county of Penobscot.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. All acts and proceedings authorized by law which have been done and performed by the inhabitants of the town of Lee, in the county of Penobscot, in town meeting assembled, prior to the passage of this act, shall be as valid and effectual as if all the preliminary forms and requirements of law relating thereto, including the posting, return and record of warrants, the administration of oaths to town officers, and record thereof, had been fully complied with; and the records of said town are hereby made legal and valid evidence of the doings of said inhabitants at any of their town meetings; but nothing contained in this act shall effect actions now pending.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

#### Chapter 2.

An act to amend "an act additional to an act incorporating the Arkwright Company," approved February ninth, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:
