Chapter 8.**CHAP. 8.**

An act to incorporate the Manufacturers' and Mechanics' Library Association of Lewiston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. David M. Ayer, Josiah G. Coburn, Rhodes A. Budlong, Marshall French, Benjamin I. Leeds and Amos D. Lockwood, their associates and successors, be and they hereby are constituted and incorporated a body politic and corporate forever, by the name of the Manufacturers' and Mechanics' Library Association of Lewiston, and by that name shall have power to prosecute and defend suits at law, to have and use a common seal, to take and hold for the objects of their association, any estate real and personal to an amount not exceeding thirty thousand dollars, and the same to use and dispose of at their pleasure, to make and execute any by-laws for the convenient management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of the state, and generally to have and enjoy all the powers and privileges incident to corporations instituted for literary and scientific purposes.

SECT. 2. The first meeting of said corporation may be called by any two of the persons named in this act by giving reasonable notice of the time and place appointed for such meeting in any public newspaper printed in Lewiston.

First meeting, how called.

SECT. 3. The power granted by this act may be enlarged, restrained or annulled at the pleasure of the legislature.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 9.

An act to incorporate the Trustees of Paris Hill Academy.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Alvah Black, Moses Hammond, Hiram Hubbard, J. K. Hammond R. K. Goodenow, Alfred Andrews, B. F. Bates, Stephen D. Hutchinson, James T. Clark, William A. Pidgin and J. C. Marble, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby constituted a corporation by the name of the Trustees of Paris Hill Academy, and by this name may sue and be sued, make such by-laws as they may deem expedient for the management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of the state, fill all vacancies occurring in their number, take and hold any estate, real or personal, that they may
