SECT. 2. If the city of Bath shall erect and complete said bridge, the said city shall thereafter have the same control thereof, and be under the same liabilities to keep it in repair as if it were wholly within the limits of said city, and said city is authorized to raise money by taxation or otherwise, for the purpose of building and maintaining said bridge.

Chapter 27.

An act to protect the property of the Kennebec Company and of, the Augusta Water Power Company, in Augusta, against fire.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legis*lature assembled*, as follows:

No person shall enter the factory, mills, machine shops, SECT. 1. or upon any street or property of said corporations lying below their dam in Augusta and within two hundred feet of the river. having with him a lighted pipe or cigar, or shall light or smoke any pipe or cigar thereon, under a penalty of five dollars for each offence, provided the owners of said property shall cause a notice in plain and legible characters to be affixed and kept up in four conspicuous places upon the main street passing through their property, that no smoking is allowed thereon.

SECT. 2. If any person shall deface, remove or destroy any such notice without the permission of the owners of said property, he shall be liable to a fine of ten dollars for each offence.

Prosecutions for an offence against the provisions of Presecutions, SECT. 3. this act shall be commenced by complaint before any municipal how comcourt in the county of Kennebec.
