SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

Chapter 29.

An act to incorporate the Tyrian Lodge of free and accepted masons.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.

SECT. 1. A. Golderman, A. P. Lamb, C. Z. Hackett, E. G. Hawkes, W. C. Dwinal, Paul Grenier, S. Atwood, F. H. Cobb, G. W. Severns, John Dore, C. H. Dwinal, Timothy Waterhouse, 2d, F. E. Dwinal, J. S. Verrill, G. W. Currier, T. F. Lamb, H. B. King, I. G. Curtis, Isaiah Woodman, O. B. Dwinal, E. M. Wight and P. R. Cobb, and their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby incorporated into a body politic, by the name of Master, Wardens and Members of Tyrian Lodge of Mechanic Falls, Maine, with powers to sue and be sued, to have a common seal and to change the same, make any by-laws for the management of their affairs not contrary to the laws of this state, nor to ancient masonic usages, to take and hold for charitable and benevolent uses, any real estate to the value of two thousand dollars, and any personal estate to the value of three thousand dollars, and to give and grant or bargain and sell the same, and with all the privileges usually granted to other societies instituted for purposes of charity and benevolence.

Corporate name.

Powers, &c.

By-laws.

May hold real and personal estate.

First meeting, how called.

SECT. 2. The first meeting of said corporation shall be at such time and place and be notified in such manner, as the majority of the persons above named may direct.

SECT. 3. The powers granted by this act may be enlarged, restrained or repealed at the pleasure of the legislature.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.
