#### Chapter 32.

An act to legalize the doings of the proprietors of and pew-holders in the congregational meeting-house in the second congregational parish in York.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Certain doings of proprietors, &c., of congre-gational meeting house in York, made valid.

Sect. 1. The acts and doings of the proprietors of and pew-holders in the congregational meeting-house in the second parish in York, in relation to the appraisal of the pews in said house in the year eighteen hundred and fifty-eight, and in relation to remodelling and repairing said house and the assignment of pews therein in the year eighteen hundred and sixty, and all sales and transfers of said pews since said assignment are hereby confirmed and made valid.

This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

### Chapter 33.

An act to incorporate Keyes' Edge Tool Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Corporators.

Calvin Keyes, D. G. Bean, S. C. Norcross, Benjamin I. Leeds, William R. Frye, Hubbard Lovejoy, Saunders Luce, William H. Stevens and George II. Pillsbury, with their associates and successors, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate by the name of Keyes' Edge Tool Company, for the manufacture of agricultural and mechanical tools, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties and liabilities provided in the laws of this state concerning manufacturing corporations.

Sect. 2. Said corporation is authorized to purchase and hold

real and personal estate, not exceeding in value three hundred

thousand dollars, to sue and be sued in their corporate name and capacity, use a common seal, and make such by-laws for the man-

agement of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of this state, as they may deem necessary. SECT. 3. Said corporation shall have its place of business at Lewiston, in the county of Androscoggin, or at such other place

within said county as they may deem proper.

First meeting, how called.

Calvin Keyes is authorized to call the first meeting of this corporation, by publishing the time and place thereof in some newspaper published in the county of Androscoggin at least fourteen days previous thereto.
