Chapter 34.

CHAP. 34.

Resolve in favor of Rufus Mansur.

Resolved, That the state treasurer be authorized and directed to pay thirty-four dollars and ninety-six cents to Rufus Mansur in exchange for a check on Norombega Bank, dated August tenth, eighteen hundred and fifty-nine, in favor of Jacob B. Pickard, treasurer of Belfast academy grant, it being the amount of the school fund appropriated to said plantation for the year eighteen hundred and fifty-nine.

Chapter 37.

Resolve authorizing the land agent to partition the state's interest in township eighteen, range five.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, this state is owner in common with proprietors holding lands undivided with them in township eighteen, range five, such ownership being detrimental to the interests of the state in said township, therefore

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to cause the state's interest in said township to be divided and set off by metes and bounds, so that such interest belonging to said state may be held in severalty; *provided* that the rights of any settler thereon shall not be effected by such division.
