CHAP. 78.

Chapter 78.

An act additional and amendatory to chapter forty of the revised statutes relating to fishing in Goose pond.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Trout in Goose pond.

Penalty for taking.

Putting pike, pickerel, &c., into Goose pond.

Penalty for, how recovered.

Sec. 27, chap. 40, R. S., repealed.

SECT. 1. If any person takes or destroys any trout in Goose pond, in the towns of Swanville, Prospect and Frankfort, between the first day of October and the last day of December, he shall forfeit three dollars for each trout. And if any person shall put into said pond any pike or pickerel or any other fish destructive to trout, he shall forfeit fifty dollars, said penalties to be recovered by an action of debt, one half thereof to the prosecutor, and half to the town where the offence is committed.

SECT. 2. The twenty-seventh section of chapter forty of the revised statutes is hereby repealed.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 79.

An act to give additional powers to cities.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Fresh meat and fish, cities have power to regulate sale of, &c.

Penalties.

SECT. 1. Any city in this state shall have power to regulate the sale of fresh meat and fish within its limits; and may ordain and establish a locality or localities, where said articles may be offered for sale.

SECT. 2. Such city may annex penalties for the breach of the provisions of any ordinance established to carry out the provisions of the preceding section.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.
