## CHAP. 143.

## Chapter 143.

An act additional relating to probate courts.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Guardianship,  
cases of, trans-  
ferred for  
probate courts  
of Lincoln and  
Waldo to Knox.

SECT. 1. All cases of guardianship, pending in the probate courts for the counties of Lincoln and Waldo, respectively, at the time of the formation of the county of Knox, and which are still pending therein, and which would fall within the jurisdiction of the probate court of the county of Knox, by the law establishing the general jurisdiction of probate courts, shall be transferred to, have day in, and be acted upon, by the probate court for the county of Knox, and the judge thereof shall have jurisdiction of the same as fully as if he had had the original jurisdiction thereof; and in all such cases, the registers of probate in the said counties of Lincoln and Waldo respectively, shall transmit copies of all records relating to such matter so pending, to the probate office of said county of Knox, to be there recorded.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from the day of its approval by the governor.

## Chapter 144.

An act including in taxable costs, any fees paid under act of congress upon legal proceedings.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Fees paid  
under act of  
congress, to be  
included in  
costs.

SECT. 1. Any tax which may be hereafter paid by any person, or party, by virtue of any tax act which is or may be passed by the congress of the United States upon any summons, writ, or proceeding in court, or upon any thing used in evidence in any suit or proceeding in court, shall be taxed as a part of the bill of costs for any prevailing party paying the same.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect on its approval by the governor.
