PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE.

1862.

SECT. 2. Said company may insure in the town of Waterford only, their respective dwelling houses, stores, shops, barns and other buildings, household furniture and other merchandize, the contents of any building in said town, against loss or damage by fire, originating in any cause, other than by design in the insured.

CHAP. 144.

May insure in Waterford, only.

SECT. 3. The first meeting may be called by any three persons named in this act, by posting up in three public places in said Waterford, notice of the time and place, at least ten days before such meeting, at which the members present may elect all necessary officers, fix their compensation, and do any corporate business then deemed necessary.

First meeting, how called.

Officers.

SECT. 4. The directors of said company at their annual meeting, in each year, shall make a full report of the condition of the company, giving a detailed account of their expenses, the amount of property actually insured at that time, and the amount of all debts due to and from the company, but shall not be required to publish the same in any newspaper as required in section thirty-two of chapter forty-nine of the revised statutes.

Directors, duty of.

SECT. 5. No policy shall be issued by said company until applications for insurance shall have been made to the amount of twenty thousand dollars.

Policies, when to issue.

SECT. 6. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 144.

An act to prevent the destruction of pickerel in Thomas pond in the town of Waterford.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. If any person shall take or destroy, otherwise than by hook and line, any pickerel in Thomas pond, so called, in the town of Waterford, or in any of the streams emptying into, or running out of said pond, he shall forfeit and pay for every pickerel so taken or destroyed a fine of one dollar, to be recovered by an action of debt, to the use of any person who may sue for the same.

Pickerel in Thomas' pond, destruction of prohibited.

Penalty, how recovered and appropriated.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.
