Chapter 147.

An act authorizing the collection of taxes in the town of Smithfield, in the county of Somerset, for the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Smithfield,

SECT. 1. The appointment of Moses Dunsmoor by the assessors of Smithfield in the county of Somerset, as collector of taxes in said town for the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty, is hereby made valid, and he is authorized and empowered to collect the taxes in said town for that year.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.
