SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved by the gov- $\underline{CHAP. 170.}$ ernor.

Chapter 170.

An act additional to "an act to incorporate the city of Biddeford."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

 S_{ECT} . 1. No member of the board of aldermen or of the common council of the city of Biddeford, shall, during the year for which he was elected, be eligible by election of the city council or either of its branches to any office of profit or emolument in said city.

Aldermen, &c., not to hold office of profit, &c.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect on its approval by the governor.

Chapter 171.

An act to amend an act entitled "an act to regulate the fishing in the Damariscotta river in the county of Lincoln."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The fish committees of the towns of Newcastle and Nobleborough, or persons in their employ or acting under contract with them, shall be allowed to take fish at the usual places on the main stream and the western branch of New River stream on each day of the week, excepting Sunday, from the first day of May to the fifteenth day of July of each year; but shall not at any time take any fish in the eastern branch of New River stream.

SECT. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.
