Chapter 101.

Resolve providing for the safe transportation and delivery of hospital stores to Maine regiments.

WHEREAS, the condition of the troops which have gone forth from our State is matter of great moment and general interest, and whereas, the patriotic liberality of our citizens is continually manifesting itself in the accumulation of articles for their use and comfort, necessarily outside of those supplied at the expense of the general government, such as hospital and other stores, which, for want of some properly constituted agency, have heretofore failed in many instances to reach those regiments for which they were intended; therefore,

Resolved, That the governor be and hereby is authorized to appoint an agent or agents, for the purpose of transporting and delivering to the Maine regiments at the seat of war, such hospital and other stores as are now ready or may hereafter be prepared for them; *provided however*, that no compensation shall be allowed said agent or agents, for their time or services, but their travelling expenses, and the cost of transportation and delivery of said stores shall be paid by the state.
