Chapter 116.**CHAP. 116.**

Resolve authorizing the conveyance of a section of land to the executors of the last will and testament of Nathan Winslow.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to convey to Samuel E. Sewall and Edward Fox, executors of the last will and testament of Nathan Winslow, late of Portland, deceased, six hundred acres of land, to be selected in any township surveyed for settlement, of average value of the land in half township E, range two, west from the east line of the state; and the conveyance, when made, shall be in full satisfaction for certificate number twenty-four, to Judith Brown, dated August twenty-eighth, eighteen hundred thirty-nine, entitling the holder to the benefits of a "resolve in favor of certain commissioned officers and others of the revolutionary war, and the widows of such persons," approved March twentieth, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and thirty-eight.

Land agent authorized to convey certain land to executors of Nathan Winslow.

Chapter 117.

Resolve in favor of Charles Griffin.

Resolved, That the governor and council be and hereby are authorized to audit the claim of Charles Griffin for services and subsistence as a private in company C, third regiment of Maine volunteers, and allow him such pay for service as he would have been entitled to by the laws of the United States had he been eligible as a soldier and honorably discharged at the time he was dismissed from said company, and such compensation for subsistence as they deem proper; and the governor is authorized to draw his warrant for the amount determined as aforesaid, to be paid out of the fund for the ten regiments raised in this state under act of April, eighteen hundred sixty-one.
