CHAP. 149.

Chapter 149.

Resolve for the repair of the state road in Indian township.

State road in
Indian town-
ship, for repair
of.

Resolved, That the sum of three hundred dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated to be expended under the direction of the land agent upon the state road leading through Indian township, in the county of Washington.

Chapter 150.

Resolve relating to the compensation of the governor's aids.

Aids of gov-
ernor, in

Resolved, That the governor and council, out of any money not otherwise appropriated, shall allow and pay to the governor's aids such compensation for their actual services and expenses during the past year as may be deemed reasonable.

Chapter 151.

Resolve in favor of the Penobscot Indians.

Penobscot
Indians, in
favor of.

Resolved, That there be paid from the treasury of the state to the agent of the Penobscot Indians, under the direction of the governor and council, the sum of one thousand six hundred and thirty-nine dollars and sixty-five cents, to be by him expended for the benefit of the Penobscot Indians, as follows:

—agriculture.

Four hundred dollars for agricultural purposes.

—schools.

Two hundred dollars for schools, to be expended under the direction of the school committees of Oldtown and Lincoln, one hundred and twenty-five for school at Oldtown Island, and seventy-five dollars for school at Mattanawcook Island, and said committees are required to report as directed by resolve of March seventeenth, eighteen hundred and sixty.

—bounties.

Five hundred and sixty-four dollars and sixty-five cents, for bounties on crops for eighteen hundred and sixty-one, not before provided for.

—salary of
agent.

Four hundred and fifty dollars for salary of agent for the year eighteen hundred and sixty-one.

John Neptune.

Twenty-five dollars shall be paid to John Neptune, the lieutenant governor, for his services in that office.
