Resolve in favor of I. H. Burleigh.

Resolved, That the governor and council be authorized to draw a warrant on the state treasurer for interest on bill of blankets furnished September, eighteen hundred sixty-one, amounting to seventy-four dollars and eighteen cents. Said blankets were furnished by I. H. Burleigh, agent, and when the account was audited the war appropriation was expended, and a warrant was not drawn for the principal until March seven, eighteen hundred and sixty-two.
