Chapter 166.

An act for the preservation of certain birds.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. If any person shall between the first day of March and the first day of September, take, kill or destroy any of the birds called quails, or between the first day of March and the fourth day of July take, kill or destroy any of the birds called woodcock, or within the respective times aforesaid, sell, buy or have in his possession, any of said birds taken or killed in this state or elsewhere, shall forfeit for every such quail or woodcock so taken, killed or destroyed, the sum of five dollars to be recovered by complaint Penalty. before any court of competent jurisdiction, one half for the complainant, and the other to the use of the town where the offence is committed.

Quails and Woodcocks not to be killed at certain times.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

Approved February 14, 1863.

Chapter 167.

An act defining the salary and compensation of the land agent.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

sture assembled, as follows:

Sect. 1. The salary of the land agent shall be fifteen hundred Land agent's salary fixed in full for all his services instead of the sum now full for all services. dollars per year in full for all his services instead of the sum now fixed by law, and no commissions shall be allowed him for his disbursements or collections, and no sum shall be allowed him for assistants in the office at Augusta or Bangor, or for travelling No clerk hire allowed, expenses from his home to land office, or from one land office to Actual travelthe other unless on official business, nor for transportation of records of office unless money shall be paid out specifically therefor.

No commissions allowed.

- All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.
- Sect. 3. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Approved February 21, 1863.
