CHAP. 176.**Chapter 176.**

An act relating to stock insurance companies.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Stock insurance
companies
exempt from
taxation in
certain cases.

SECT. 1. That whenever the capital stock of any insurance company incorporated in this state is taxed at its full value, the securities and pledges held by said company, to the amount of said stock, shall be exempt from taxation.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Approved March 9, 1863.

Chapter 177.

An act to alter the January term of the county commissioners court for Lincoln county.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Commissioners'
court Lincoln,
change time
holding of.

The term of the county commissioners court of the county of Lincoln, which is now required to be holden on the second Tuesday of January annually, shall hereafter be holden on the last Monday of December of each year prior to that time.

Approved March 9, 1863.

Chapter 178.

An act to change the time of holding the law term of the supreme judicial court in the county of Cumberland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

C. Cumberland,
change time of.

SECT. 1. The term of the supreme judicial court, as a court of law, held at Portland, in the county of Cumberland, in the western district, shall hereafter be held on the third Tuesday of July instead of the second.

SECT. 2. All matters and things appropriate to the term of said court shall be returnable to and have day in the term of said court established in the pending section, the same as they would have had at the term before established.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.
