SECT. 4. The commissioners appointed by virtue of this act, before proceeding, shall notify the county attorney of Penobscot county, whose duty it shall be to be present at the hearing and attend to the interests of the county. Commissioners

SECT. 5. This act shall be in force when approved by the governor.

Chapter 254.

An act additional to an act to incorporate the city of Bangor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The city council of Bangor is authorized and empowered to improve the navigation of the harbors of the city of Bangor, embracing the Kenduskeag stream below the Kenduskeag bridge, and the Penobscot river from the northerly line of the town of Hampden to the Bangor bridge, by the erection of suitable buoys and piers, the clearing out of the rocks and other obstructions in the bed of said stream and river, and to otherwise improve its navigation. Authorized to

SECT. 2. The amount expended for said improvements shall be paid from the contingent fund by a warrant drawn by the mayor on the city treasurer. Expenses, how
paid.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 255.

An act authorizing George K. Jewett and others to extend wharves and piers into tide waters of Penobscot river.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. George K. Jewett and the heirs of Leonard March, and their associates and assigns, are hereby authorized to extend wharves and piers into tide waters at a place called High Head Authorized to

CHAP. 256. at Bangor, but so as not to interfere with or obstruct the navigation of Penobscot river.

SECT. 2. This act to take effect when approved.

Chapter 256.

An act to change the corporate name of the Maine Wesleyan Seminary.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporate
name changed.

SECT. 1. The corporate name of the trustees of the Maine Wesleyan Seminary shall hereafter be Maine Wesleyan Seminary and Female College.

Rights, powers,
&c., not to be
impaired.

SECT. 2. Nothing in this act contained shall be construed to impair or annul any of the obligations, rights, powers or privileges of the said corporation, or to invalidate its claim to any donations, legacies or bequests made to the trustees of the Maine Wesleyan Seminary, or to the trustees of the Maine Wesleyan Seminary and Female Collegiate Institute.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 257.

An act to make valid the doings of the town of Peru.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Peru, doings of
selectmen of,
made valid.

SECT. 1. The doings of the selectmen of the town of Peru, in the county of Oxford, in issuing their warrant for the annual town meeting of said town, holden on the second day of March, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred sixty-three, and all acts and proceedings of said town at their annual meeting under said warrant on second day of March, are hereby made lawful and valid.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect on its approval.
