#### Chapter 215.

#### Resolve in favor of James R. Bachelder.

James R. Bach-elder, in favor of

WHEREAS. The land agent on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and fifty-three, for the sum of eleven thousand three hundred and fifty-four dollars and fifty cents paid by James R. Bachelder, deeded to him an undivided half of township numbered twenty in the eleventh and twelfth ranges of townships west from the east line of the state, and the deed was duly recorded in the land office but was never delivered to said Bachelder and is now lost: therefore,

Deed, copy to J. R. Bachelder.

Resolved, That a copy of said deed duly certified by the land agent shall have the force of the original deed to confirm the title to the land therein described to the said Bachelder, and may be used in any court as evidence of such title, and the register of deeds for Aroostook county, where said land is situated may record said copy as if it were the original deed and full credence shall be given to such record.

#### Chapter 216.

Resolve authorizing the governor and council to settle with the bondsmen of Sumner and Maxey.

Resolved, That the governor and council be and they are hereby fully empowered to settle with the bondsmen of Messrs. Sumner and Maxcy, contractors for the labor of the Maine state prisoners under contract of January first, eighteen hundred and sixty.

#### Chapter 217.

Resolve in relation to collectors of taxes in the county of Washington.

**Collectors** of taxes, election

Resolved, That the inhabitants of the several towns and plantations in the county of Washington, be and hereby are allowed the privilege of electing, at their annual town meetings, non-residents for collectors of taxes in said towns and plantations.
