CHAP. 221.

Chapter 221.

Resolve in favor of Joseph Attean and John Neptune.

Joseph Attean
and John Nep-
tune, in favor
of.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Indian fund of the Penobscot tribe of Indians, the sum of fifty dollars, to be expended by the agent of said tribe as follows: twenty-five dollars for the benefit of Joseph Attean, governor of said tribe, and twenty-five dollars for the benefit of John Neptune, the lieutenant governor now of said tribe.

Chapter 222.

Resolve in aid of building a bridge at Mattawamkeag forks.

Bridge at
Mattawamkeag
Forks, in aid
of.
Proviso.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to expend one thousand dollars towards the reconstruction of the bridge at Mattawamkeag forks on the military road; *provided*, that there shall, in addition to the sum named, be sufficient amount subscribed and paid in to complete said bridge to the acceptance of the land agent.

Chapter 223.

Resolve in aid of mills in south half of township numbered two, range three, west east line state, in the county of Aroostook.

Peter Moulton,
in favor of.

Resolved, That the land agent be and he is hereby authorized to convey to Peter Moulton, four lots of land in the south half of township number two, range three, west east line state, of equal quantity to the lots contemplated for said Moulton in the southwest quarter of township number six, range four, west east line state, in resolve in his favor approved March fifteen, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, which resolve is hereby repealed. One-half of the land to be conveyed when he shall give satisfactory assurance to the land agent that he has completed and put in good running order a single saw-mill, and the remaining half when he shall complete a grist-mill suited to the wants of the inhabitants upon said half township; *provided*, that said mills shall be completed within two years from the passage of this resolve.
