Chapter 224.

CHAP. 224.

Resolves providing for the establishment of military agencies.

Resolved, That the governor with the advice and consent of the council, is hereby authorized to appoint an agent or agents to reside at Washington, District of Columbia, and at such other points as they shall deem necessary, whose duty it shall be in general terms to look after the interests of the Maine volunteers, and especially to attend to such duties relating to the welfare of the sick, wounded and disabled soldiers from this state, as the governor and council may from time to time prescribe and direct.

Military agencies, appointment of.

Resolved, That the governor with the advice and consent of the council, may appoint one or more agents to superintend the transportation and delivery of hospital and other stores for the use of our soldiers at Washington, or elsewhere, as occasion may require. The said agent or agents to be subject to the direction and control of the governor and council.

Same.

Resolved, That the governor and council be and they are hereby required to fix the compensation of such agent or agents as may be appointed by authority of the foregoing resolves, and also to audit and pay all bills for expenditures incurred under the provisions thereof.

Compensation.

Resolved, That a resolve entitled a "resolve providing for the safe transportation and delivery of hospital stores to Maine regiments," approved January seventh, eighteen hundred sixty-two, be and is hereby repealed.

Resolve of 1862, repealed.

Approved February 26, 1863.

Chapter 225.

Resolve in favor of Daniel Randall and David A. Sewall.

Resolved, That the land agent be and he is hereby authorized to convey to Daniel Randall and David A. Sewall, four lots of land suitable for settlement, of one hundred sixty acres each, in township numbered four, range four, west from the east line of the state; which conveyance when made shall be in full for any claim for additional compensation for building bridges in said township.
