Chapter 241.

Resolves for the preservation of the title of the Penobscot Indians to certain islands in Penobscot river.

Resolved, That the attorney general be and he is hereby required to furnish to the governor, immediately, his opinion in writing, whether the title of the Penobscot tribe of Indians to the islands called Grassy islands, lying in the Penobscot river near Oldtown island, is now valid.

Penobscot Indians, title to certain islands, relating to.

Resolved, That if said opinion shall be favorable to the validity of the title of said tribe to said islands, the governor, upon the receipt thereof, is hereby authorized and requested to cause the necessary legal proceedings to be commenced and prosecuted to final judgment, for the purpose of settling the question of said title and vesting possession of said islands in said tribe.

Chapter 242.

Resolve in favor of Spencer G. Bowes.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state to Spencer G. Bowes of Washington, county of Knox, six dollars per month, during the pleasure of the legislature, for injuries received while in the service of the state as a soldier in the Aroostook war, and that the pension of six dollars per month commence on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and sixty-three.
