*Resolved*, That the resolve in favor of Charles U. Buckmar, approved August seven, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, be and the same is hereby repealed.

### Chapter 257.

Resolve in favor of the towns of Bremen and Smyrna and Macwahoc plantation.

*Resolved*, That the towns of Bremen and Smyrna, and Macwahoc plantation, be allowed to present their claims against the state for aid furnished families of volunteers, to be audited and allowed in the same manner as if they had been presented previous to the expiration of the time specified for such returns to be made.

### Chapter 258.

Resolve for the payment of expenses incurred in negotiating state loan.

*Resolved*, That there be paid to Nathan Dane, treasurer of state, the sum of two hundred fifty dollars and forty-six cents, being amount paid for bill of lithographing state bonds and advertising for proposals for state loan.

### Chapter 259.

Resolve in addition to resolve in favor of Henry Upton.

*Resolved*, That instead of the pension of eight dollars per month now allowed to Henry Upton of Norway, by a resolve approved the twenty-second day of February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, there shall be paid to him out of the treasury of the state the sum of four dollars per month from and after the approval of this resolve, and said pension of four dollars per month shall continue during the pleasure of the legislature.
