Chapter 294.

CHAP. 294.

An act to incorporate the Portland and Machias Steamboat Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. John B. Brown, T. C. Hersey, J. G. True, Seth M. Milliken, R. O. Conant, Samuel E. Spring, Jabez True, N. O. Cram, John Randall, Willard H. Woodbury, W. F. Milliken, John True, John Lynch, George W. Woodman, Daniel W. True, Henry A. Jones, John C. Brooks, J. B. Carroll, Charles Fobes, H. Warren Lancey, and their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate by the name of the Portland and Machias Steamboat Company, for the purpose of carrying on the business of navigation by vessels propelled by steam or otherwise, between the city of Portland and the town of Machias and any intermediate ports or places, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties and liabilities provided by the general laws of this state.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said corporation shall not be less than five hundred nor more than two thousand shares of one hundred dollars each ; any person subscribing to said stock shall be personally liable to pay the assessments thereon not exceeding one hundred dollars per share.

SECT. 3. Any three persons named in this act may call the first meeting of said corporation, for the purpose of organizing the same, by giving notice to each corporator or by publication in some newspaper printed in Portland at least seven days before the time appointed for said meeting.

First meeting, how called.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 295.

An act additional to incorporate the Portland and Kennebec Railroad Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The Portland and Kennebec Railroad Company is hereby authorized at any time within three years to locate its road from a point in the track of the York and Cumberland Railroad, about five hundred feet northerly of the intersection of said railroad with the north line of the road leading from Deering's bridge to Saccarappa, and thence on a radius of seven hundred and twenty-five feet to a post in the westerly corner of the Haley house lot ;
