CHAP. 305.

Liability of stockholders.

SECT. 3. Any three persons named in this act may call the first meeting of said corporation for the purpose of organization, by giving notice thereof to each corporator, or by publishing notice in some newspaper printed in Portland, at least seven days before the time appointed for said meeting.

First meeting, how called.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 305.

An act to prohibit gathering cranberries in the town of Cutler, before the first day of September of each year.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. No person shall gather highland cranberries on any land or lands within the town of Cutler, of which he or she is not the lawful owner or in lawful possession, at any time before the first day of September, of each year, under a penalty of ten dollars for each offence.

Cranberries, gathering in Cutler, prohibited.

Penalty.

SECT. 2. This penalty may be recovered in an action of debt by any person, in any court competent to try the same, one half to the use of the plaintiff, the other half to the county.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect on its approval by the governor.

Chapter 306.

An act to provide in part for the expenditures of government.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. In order to provide for several acts and resolves of the legislature requiring the payment of money from the treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of government for the current fiscal year, the following sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury; and the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, is hereby authorized at any time

Chapter 307.

An act to change the town line between Thomaston and Warren.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The town line between the towns of Thomaston and Warren shall be established as follows : beginning in the centre of the channel of Oyster river below Elder point, near the head of tide water, where the town lines now cross said river and following down said river in the channel to the channel of Georges river ; thence down said channel till it intersects the town lines where it crosses said Georges river.

SECT. 2. In imposing state and county taxes after the passage of this act, the state valuation of the town of Thomaston shall be increased by adding thereto the sum of seven thousand dollars ; and that of the town of Warren shall be correspondingly diminished by deducting therefrom the sum of seven thousand dollars until a new state valuation shall be made.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from its approval by the governor.

Chapter 308.

An act to change the name of Alpha M. Varnum.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Alpha M. Varnum of Bucksport, shall be allowed to take the name of Viola M. Harriman from the approval of this act by the governor.
