SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

Approved February 29, 1864.

### Chapter 335.

An act additional to the act to incorporate the Baskahegan Dam Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. The dam which the Baskahegan Dam Company is authorized to build at the outlet of Baskahegan lake, may be built either at the outlet, or at such other point down the Baskahegan stream below the lake, as the company may find and consider most judicious.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

### Chapter 336.

An act to maintain a dam across Penamaquan river in Pembroke.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. Theodore Lincoln, Edmund Lincoln and Thomas Lincoln, their heirs and assigns, are hereby authorized to maintain a dam across Penamaquan river on their own land at or near the bluff head, in the town of Pembroke, for mill and manufacturing purposes, the gateway in said dam to be in or across the channel and not to be less than thirty-five feet wide, and to be opened two hours before the next high water after twelve hours notice whenever any person wishes to pass through the same ; *providing* nothing herein contained shall in any way affect the law relating to fishways.

Authorized to maintain dam.

Proviso.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.
