PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

CHAP. 354. payments out of the treasury of the county, from and after the first day of April next, which shall be in full for all services and duties required of him by law.

Commissions to
paid into co.
treasury.

SECT. 2. He shall pay into the county treasury all commissions received by him.

When to take
effect.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect on the thirty first day of March, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and sixty-four.

Chapter 354.

An act to provide for the adoption of William Samuel McCausland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Name changed,
&c.

SECT. 1. The child adopted by Mrs. Ann Elizabeth McCausland of Waterville, shall take the name of William Samuel McCausland, and shall have the same relation to said Ann Elizabeth McCausland, in all respects, as though he had been her own child, including the right of inheritance.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

Chapter 355.

An act to incorporate the Foreign Emigrant Association of Maine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.

SECT. 1. George F. Patten, N. A. Farwell, L. L. Wadsworth, junior, S. E. Spring, Joseph Eaton, Richard D. Rice, George Stetson, Lewis Barker, S. H. Talbot, Esreff H. Banks, John D. Hopkins, Jeremiah Dingley, junior, E. G. Dunn, Philander Coburn, William McGilvery, Francis Cobb, Rufus S. Stevens, Franklin Muzzey and Joseph Day, with their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a body politic and corporate by the name of the Foreign Emigrant Association of Maine, for the purpose of aiding and encouraging emigration from Europe to this state, and by that name may prosecute and defend suits at law and equity, have and use a common seal, and make by-laws for the management of their concerns not repugnant to the laws of this state.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said association shall be fifty thousand dollars, divided into shares of one hundred dollars each, with power to increase said capital stock by a vote of a majority of its members to one hundred thousand dollars; and said association shall have power to appoint and maintain agents for the management of its affairs in this country and in Europe, and all contracts made by said agents in any foreign country shall be held as valid and binding in this state.

SECT. 3. The first meeting of said association may be called by any three persons named in the first section of this act, by public notice thereof in any newspaper printed in each of the cities of Portland and Bangor, stating the time and place of said meeting.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Lenfest; Walter Brown of Albion, shall be allowed to take the name of Walter Morrison; Alpha M. Varnum of Bucksport, shall be allowed to take the name of Viola M. Harriman; Sophrona M. Cushman of Hebron, shall be allowed to take the name of Sophrona M. Bonney; Alvah Gibson of Farmington, shall be allowed to take the name of Charles Alvah Morrill; Benjamin Cox of Hebron, shall be allowed to take the name of Benjamin Watson; Laurinda Geer of Lewiston, shall be allowed to take the name of Laurinda Stevens; Margaret G. Jones and Nettie M. Jones of Jefferson, shall be allowed to take the name of Margaret G. Weeks and Nettie M. Weeks; Cornelius T. S. B.
