Chapter 410.

CHAP. 410.

An act explanatory of, and amending an act additional to and amendatory of an act to provide means for the defence of the northeastern frontier.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Section third of said act is hereby amended in the ninth line after the word "discharge" by striking out the words "or assign and transfer."

Sec. 3, amended.

SECT. 2. Section one of said act shall be further construed and amended so to apply to moneys, securities or lands hereafter received on account of the claims of Maine on the United States government and not to such as have been heretofore received.

Sec. 1, how construed and amended.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect on its approval by the governor.

Approved March 25, 1864.

Chapter 411.

An act to enable stockholders in the Kennebec and Portland Railroad Company to call a meeting for the choice of officers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. In case of an omission to call the annual meeting of the Kennebec and Portland Railroad Company the current year by the persons, if any in whom the power to call such meeting now rests, any justice of the peace for the county of Kennebec, Cumberland or Sagadahoc, upon written application made to him for the purpose, by three stockholders in the said company, at any time during the present year, may issue his warrant to either of such applicants directing him to call a meeting of the said corporation at some suitable place within either of the said counties, to be named by the said justice, and at such time as the said justice shall appoint for the election of the officers thereof, by publishing in a newspaper printed in each of the said counties, and in the state paper, seven days at least before the day fixed for the meeting, a notice setting forth the time, place and purpose of such meeting.

Officers, election of.

SECT. 2. All officers duly elected at such meeting are to hold their respective offices and their official acts are to be considered legal until other officers are legally chosen and qualified in their stead.

Term of office.
