Resolve in favor of Charles O. McKinney.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury to Charles O. McKinney, the sum of six hundred dollars, and that the governor be authorized to draw his warrant on the treasurer for the same.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury to John Decker of Boothbay, the sum of one hundred and thirty-two dollars, and that the governor be authorized to draw his warrant on the treasurer for the same.

Resolve in favor of Isabella Fogg.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury to Isabella Fogg, the sum of two hundred dollars, and that the governor be authorized to draw his warrant on the treasurer for the same.

Chapter 316.

Resolve authorizing the land agent to convey certain lots of land to the widows of deceased soldiers.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to convey to the following named parties, widows of deceased soldiers, the lots of land upon which the families of such soldiers had resided prior to their enlistment in the United States service; and the land agent in the deeds of conveyance is further authorized to remit all remaining settling duties and balances due for road labor, upon the several lots named in this resolve. Margaret E. McGlauffin, widow of Josiah McGlauffin, private in company B, seventh regiment Maine volunteers, killed at Chancellorsville, May third, eighteen hundred sixty-three, lot eighty-six in township twelve, rangé three.

Eliza C. Prouty, widow of Levi Prouty, private in company B, eleventh regiment Maine volunteers, died in service, lot numbered forty-four in south half of township two, range three. Hannah E. Brainard, widow of Isaac L. Brainard, private in company B, fourteenth regiment Maine volunteers, lot numbered sixty in township C, range one. Mary S. McGuier, widow of Warren McGuier, private in company C, fifteenth regiment Maine volunteers, died in service November twenty-six, eighteen hundred sixty-two, lot numbered forty in township thirteen, range three. Polena C. Varney, widow of Aaron C. Varney, private in company C, ninth regiment Maine volunteers, died at Beaufort, South Carolina, August twenty-one, eighteen hundred sixty-three, lot numbered ninety-four in township twelve, range four. Susan A. De Laite, widow of Reuben A. De Laite, private in company G, fifteenth regiment Maine volunteers, died at New Orleans, October six, eighteen hundred sixty-three, lot numbered sixty-eight in township C, range one.

Chapter 318.

Resolves authorizing a loan in behalf of the state.

Resolved, That to provide for the payment of the temporary loan authorized by a resolve approved February third, eighteen hundred sixty-four, and for the payment of bounties authorized by the legislature, and also for the payment of aid to families of volunteers for the year eighteen hundred and sixty-three, the treasurer of state with the advice of the governor be and he hereby is authorized to procure on the faith of the state from time to time whenever the public exigences may require, a loan or loans, for the purpose of war aforesaid, at or above par, of three millions of dol-
