Resolved, That the sum of seventy-five dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated, to be expended under the direction of the land agent, upon the Baring and Houlton road, in township number eleven, range one, in the county of Aroostook.

Chapter 321.

Resolve authorizing the land agent to examine into the situation of the land occupied by settlers on township eighteen, range three.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to examine into the situation of the land occupied by settlers, in the rear of the river lots in township eighteen, range three; and if in his judgment, with the advice of the governor and council, he shall determine that the material and social condition of the settlers upon such land requires the letting out so much of said township as is occupied by them, that if an equitable exchange can be effected with the proprietors for land in other parts of said township for their moiety in the tract required for the settlers, then he is hereby authorized to make an exchange, and report his action in the premises to the governor and council; and if approved by them, may under their direction, cause the tract occupied by the settlers to be surveyed into lots for occupancy under the laws regulating the sale of land to settlers.

Chapter 322.

Resolve in favor of Samuel H. Allen and Thomas O'Brien.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of state, from moneys not otherwise appropriated, to Samuel H. Allen and Thomas O'Brien, the sum of seven thousand five hundred and five dollars and eighty-nine cents, in full satisfaction of a judgment in their favor rendered by the supreme judicial court, and dated the eighteenth of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four.
