Chapter 357.

Resolve for the purchase of copies of the revised statutes.

Resolved, That the secretary of state be authorized to purchase Revised statfor the use of the state, not exceeding twenty-five copies of the use of the state of the state of the state of the use of the revised statutes, at a price not exceeding three dollars per copy, to be paid for by any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.

Chapter 358.

Resolve in relation to the national cemetery at Gettysburg.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of National twenty-five hundred dollars, to defray Maine's proportion of the Gettysburg, expense of the national cemetery at Gettysburg, and that the for. twenty-five hundred dollars, to defray Maine's proportion of the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, is hereby authorized to draw his warrant for so much thereof as is needed to discharge the obligations of the state, and the governor is hereby authorized to appoint a trustee, under any act of incorporation passed, or that may be passed by the legislature of the state of Pennsylvania, relating to the national cemetery at Gettysburg.

Chapter 359.

Resolve authorizing the treasurer of state to deposit funds of the state with the assistant treasurers of the United States.

Resolved, That the treasurer of state be and he hereby is authorized to deposit on interest from time to time, whenever the condition of the treasury will warrant it, with the assistant treasurers of the United States, or any of them, such sum or sums of money in the treasury as he may think it for the benefit of the state so to deposit, accounting to the state for all interest he may receive therefor.
