herein referred to, he shall be liable to pay a fine of fifty dollars for Chap. 306. each and every refusal or neglect, to be recovered by indictment, one half to the use of the complainant and one half to the use of the county.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect upon its approval. Approved February 22, 1865.

#### Chapter 306.

An act to change the time of holding the county commissioners' court for Kennebec county.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The terms of the county commissioners' court of the Terms of co. county of Kennebec, which are now required to be held on the last Tuesday of April, and on the second Tuesday of August, in each year, shall hereafter be held on the third Tuesday of April and on the third Tuesday of August, of each year.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect on the first day of June next. Approved February 23, 1865.

#### Chapter 307.

An act concerning the militia.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Enrolment, exemption, etc.

SECT. 1. Every able-bodied male citizen, resident within this Persons to be state, of the age of eighteen years and under the age of forty-five years, shall be enrolled in the militia.

SECT. 2. The following persons shall be enrolled, but exempted from military duty, in the militia, viz:—the vice-president of the United States; the officers, judicial and executive, of the government of the United States; the members of both houses of congress and their respective officers; all custom-house officers; pilots and mariners employed in the sea service of any citizen or merchant within the United States; soldiers in the army and seamen in the navy of the United States; all post-masters, post-officers, postriders, and stage-drivers employed in the care and conveyance of the mail of the post-office of the United States; all ferrymen employed at any ferry on the post-road. Also all justices of courts

Exempt from military duty.
