CHAP. 435.**Chapter 435.**

An act to incorporate the Maine Beater Press Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Incorporators.

SECT. 1. Richard D. Rice, Charles A. Lambard, Royal Ball, James G. Blaine, George W. Ricker, Robert A. Cony, Artemas Libby, Albert L. Dennison, Ira D. Sturges, Alfred W. Johnson and Charles B. Hazeltine, their associates and successors, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate by the name of the Maine Beater Press Company, with power to purchase, use, lease and assign the patents issued by the United States to John K. Harris for his Beater Press, and any other patent or patents for presses, in and for the State of Maine, and to purchase, use and convey real and personal estate necessary and convenient for carrying on the business aforesaid, not exceeding in value the capital stock of said corporation ; and for these purposes shall have all the powers and be subject to all the duties and requirements of the laws of this state, defining the general powers and duties incident to manufacturing corporations. And said corporation shall have a capital stock of four hundred thousand dollars, to be divided into shares of one hundred dollars each.

Corporate name.

May hold real and personal estate.

Powers, privileges, &c.

Capital stock, \$400,000.

First meeting, how called.

SECT. 2. The first meeting of said corporation may be called to be held at Augusta, by any three of the persons named in this act, by publishing notice thereof in the *Maine Farmer*, a newspaper published at Augusta, ten days before the time set for said meeting.

SECT. 3. This act shall be in force from its approval by the governor.

Chapter 436.

An act to change the name of Nancy J. Huey.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Name changed.

SECT. 1. Nancy J. Huey of Bristol, shall be allowed to take the name of Nanie J. McClintock.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.
