right to apply the income thereof for the support of public worship Chap. 481. in said parish.

SECT. 2. Said parish, at a legal meeting thereof, may appoint Sale, how their treasurer, as their agent, to make a conveyance of said property; and upon such appointment, it shall be his duty to convey all the real estate of said parish to said society, and pay over all funds in his hands to said society, to be held and used for the purposes named in the preceding section.

This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 481.

An act to authorize the construction of a wharf in the town of Kittery.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sect. 1. Andrew J. Stimson and Martin V. B. Stimson, their heirs and assigns, are hereby authorized to construct and maintain a wharf on their land in the town of Kittery, in the county of York, bordering on the shore of Piscataqua river at the foot of Commercial street, Navy Yard Village, so called, and extending into and over tide waters, a sufficient distance to afford a depth of ten feet of water, at low water, at lowest course of tides; said wharf, not to exceed forty feet in width, and thirty-five feet in length beyond low water mark, at low course of tides.

Andrew J. Stimson and Martin V. B. Stimson autherized to construct a wharf, &c.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 482.

An act to incorporate the Kennebec Horticultural Society.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. That Edward A. Nason, Calvin Spaulding, E. K. But- Corporators. ler, Samuel Titcomb, E. A. Boardman, James W. North, Erastus Bartlett, Luther L. Allen, Russell Eaton, Thomas C. Noble, Joseph W. Clapp, Melvin Cunningham, O. C. Whitehouse, Hiram Fuller, Warren Percival, Thomas S. Lang and William T. Johnson, with their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby constituted a Corporate corporation by the name of the Kennebec Horticultural Society,

for the purpose of promoting horticulture in the county of Kennebec.

Powers, privileges, &c. SECT. 2. Said corporation shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the liabilities of like corporations.

Corporation, where located.

Annual meeting, where held.

SECT. 3. Said corporation shall be located at Augusta, in the county of Kennebec, where the annual meeting shall be held, in conformity to such by-laws as may be adopted; and any two of the corporators may call the first meeting of said corporators, by giving reasonable notice in the Maine Farmer, for that purpose.

Sect. 4. This act shall be in force after its signature by the governor.

Chapter 483.

An act to authorize the building of a dyke or dam across Marsh bay, in Gouldsborough, in the county of Hancock.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Edmond L. Young & als., authorized to construct dam, &c. Sect. 1. Edmund L. Young, Wm. Handy, Wm. Haskell and Eli Handy, their heirs and assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to build and maintain a good and sufficient dam or dyke across the tide waters of Marsh bay, in Gouldsborough, in the county of Hancock, extending from Roaring Brook Island on Marsh Point shore to Clement Y. Bunker's land, about one hundred rods north of the second dyke.

Sect. 2. This act shall be in force after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 484.

An act to incorporate the Rumford Bridge Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sect. 1. Lyman Rawson, Charles A. Kimball, Timothy Walker, Jeremiah Wardwell and Patrick H. Virgin, with their associates and successors, are hereby constituted a body corporate by the name of the Rumford Bridge Company, for the purpose of erecting and keeping in repair a bridge over the Androscoggin river in Rumford; and said corporation shall have power to purchase
