Chapter 486.

CHAP. 486.

An act to amend chapter one hundred seventy-three of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-two, to incorporate the proprietors of Union Mills Bridge, and granting a right to demand tolls.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Section three of chapter one hundred and seventy-three of the private and special laws of the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, is hereby amended, so that the tolls to be demanded, shall be as follows :—A toll is hereby granted and established for the use and benefit of said corporation, according to the following rates, to wit: for each horse and rider, three cents ; for each horse and wagon or other vehicle, drawn by one horse, five cents ; for each cart, wagon, sleigh, sled or other vehicle drawn by two beasts, eight cents ; and for each additional beast, three cents ; and for each foot passenger, one cent ; for neat cattle and horses, not in harness, one cent.

Rates of toll.

SECT. 2. So much of said chapter as is inconsistent with the provisions of this act is hereby repealed ; and this act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

Chapter 487.

An act to amend "an act to secure the proper expenditure of school moneys in the Madawaska townships."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The first section of chapter two hundred fifty-one, special laws of eighteen hundred sixty-three, is hereby amended, by adding the words, *together with sixteen, in the seventh, otherwise known as Eagle Lake plantation*, to the clause ending with "ninth ranges inclusive."

Special laws of 1863, chapter 251, section 1, amended.

SECT. 2. The words, "*irrespective of the payment of any state tax,*" which were stricken from section seven, of same chapter, by an amendment, chapter three hundred twenty, special acts of eighteen hundred sixty-four, are hereby restored.

Chap. 220, special laws of 1864, repealed.

SECT. 3. The eighth section of said act is amended, so as to read :—*Such agent shall receive in compensation for his services, one dollar a day, and travelling expenses, to be paid from the treasury on the governor's warrant, when audited and approved by the council.*
