Chapter 506.

CHAP. 506.

An act to empower the collector of Abbot, to collect school district tax in district number one, in said town.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The collector of taxes in and for the town of Abbot, is fully authorized and empowered to collect any and all school district taxes assessed on the property and polls within the limits of school district number one, as it was when the tax was voted to be raised, not heretofore paid or abated and committed to him for collection by the assessors of said Abbot, during the year eighteen hundred and sixty-three, notwithstanding any defect or omission in any proceedings previous to said commitment.

Collector of Abbot authorized, &c., to collect certain taxes, in district No. 1.

SECT. 2. This act shall not affect any pending action.

Act not to effect pending actions.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its approval.

Chapter 507.

An act relating to the record of births and marriages in Grand Isle, Madawaska, Dionne and Van Buren plantations, in the county of Aroostook.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The clerks of Grand Isle, Madawaska, Dionne and Van Buren plantations, in the county of Aroostook, are hereby severally required to procure and record in the manner required by existing laws, the births and marriages of all such persons as were born or married in said plantations respectively, so far as the same may be found on any existing record in the British Province of New Brunswick, or may come to the knowledge of the several clerks of said plantations, and such record so made by said clerks, respectively, shall have the same force and effect as though originally made by them.

Clerks of Grand Isle, &c., required to procure and record certain births and marriages.

SECT. 2. The clerks of said plantations shall be entitled for said services, to the same fees as are now allowed by law for recording births. And such compensation for procuring the transcript of the records in New Brunswick, and for recording marriages, as the assessors of each of said plantations may determine to be reasonable, their decision to be final; which fees and compensation shall be paid by said plantations respectively.

Fees for recording births. Compensation for procuring transcripts, &c. Fees, &c., how paid.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.
