CHAP. 375.

Copies of resolve to be transmitted to senators, &c.

Resolved, That a copy of these resolves be transmitted to our senators and our representatives in congress, and that they be requested to omit no efforts to secure the early passage of the resolution, providing for a submission of the proposed amendment of the constitution, to the several states.

Chapter 375.

Resolve for the relief of Nathan Weston.

Land agent authorized to convey certain lands to Nathan Weston.

Resolved, That the land agent be and he is hereby authorized to convey to the said Weston, the interest of the state in the southwest quarter of township number eight, range seven, west of the east line of the state, which has been forfeited, upon such terms and conditions as in his judgment may be for the interest of the state.

Chapter 376.

Resolve authorizing the governor and council to audit and settle the claim of Edward Sands.

Edward Sands, in favor of.

Resolved, That the governor and council be and hereby are authorized, without the usual vouchers, to audit and settle the claim of Edward Sands for sums paid out by him while acting as quartermaster of the Lewiston Light Infantry, during the time in which said company were responding to the order of Gov. Coburn placing them at the disposal of the United States authorities for the purpose of enforcing the enrolment act in July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, allowing said Sands on evidence that may be satisfactory to them, such sums as they may deem just and equitable.

Chapter 377.

Resolve in favor of Albert H. Sawyer.

A. H. Sawyer, in favor of.

Resolved, That the governor and council be authorized to audit the claims of Albert H. Sawyer, of Calais, for moneys paid out and

expended in the pursuit and capture of John C. Gove, late of Weston, in the county of Aroostook, indicted for a felonious assault with intent to kill and murder, and that the governor be and hereby is authorized to draw his order on the treasurer in favor of said Sawyer, for such sum as shall be found just and reasonable.

Chapter 378.

Resolve in favor of Joseph Carriveau.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to deed to Joseph Carriveau, lots numbered seventy-one and seventy-three, in township letter L, range two, in the county of Aroostook, provided said lots are not otherwise appropriated.

Chapter 379.

Resolve in favor of James Walker.

Resolved, That the land agent is hereby authorized to convey to James Walker, lot four, in section eleven, township E, range one, county of Aroostook.

James Walker, in favor of.

Chapter 380.

Resolve in favor of Hazen Keech.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to deed to Hazen Keech, lot number ninety, in Forestville plantation, Aroostook county, upon his complying with the requisite settling duties, excepting the building of a house and settling on the same.
