Chapter 402.

Resolve in favor of Joseph Nicolar.

Resolved, That there be paid from the treasury the sum of sev- Joseph Nicolar, enty-five dollars to Joseph Nicolar for his services before the leg- in favor of. islature as representative for the Penobscot tribe of Indians.

Approved February 22, 1865.

Chapter 403.

Resolve in relation to the Penobscot tribe of Indians.

Resolved, That the Penobscot tribe of Indians are hereby authorized to choose their governor, lieutenant governor and representative to the legislature, and to manage their municipal officers in such way and manner as they may see fit, doing nothing contrary to the laws of this state in regard to the tribe.
