CHAP. 410.**Chapter 410.**

Resolve in favor of the joint standing committee on the state prison

Elias J. Hale,

Resolved, That the state treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to pay E. J. Hale the sum of one hundred and twenty dollars; it being for expenses incurred by the committee visiting the state prison the ninth of February inst.

Chapter 411.

Resolve directing the printing of certain documents.

Secretary of
state to cause
the printing of
certain reports.

Resolved, That it shall be the duty of the secretary of state, prior to the commencement of each session of the legislature, or as soon thereafter as practicable, to cause to be printed for the use of the legislature, of the annual reports of the treasurer, warden of the state prison, trustees and superintendent of the insane hospital, and trustees and superintendent of the reform school, fifteen hundred copies each; and of the annual reports of the bank commissioners and of the land agent, one thousand copies each; and of such other documents as the governor may think proper to lay before the legislature, such number of copies as he may direct. The resolve approved March sixteenth, eighteen hundred and fifty-five, directing the printing of certain documents, and all other resolves relating to the same subject, are hereby repealed.

Resolve authorizing the land agent to convey a lot of land to Julius C. Chandler.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to convey to Julius C. Chandler, lot numbered one hundred fifteen, in township twelve, range three, in the county of Aroostook, and in the deed of conveyance the land agent may remit all remaining settling duties.
