CHAP. 417.**Chapter 417.**

Resolve authorizing the land agent to convey a lot of land to Abba A. Rose.

Land agent to convey certain land to Abba A. Rose.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to convey to Abba A. Rose, widow of Moses Rose junior, late of Presque Isle, in the county of Aroostook, lot numbered fifty-six, in township F, range two, W. E. L. S., and in the deed of conveyance further settling duties may be remitted.

Approved February 24, 1865.

Chapter 418.

Resolve in favor of the state prison.

State prison, \$3,500 appropriated, &c.

Resolved, That the sum of thirty-five hundred dollars is hereby appropriated for the building of a shoe shop and piggery, and other necessary repairs of the state prison, to be paid out under the direction of the governor and council.

Approved February 24, 1865.

Chapter 419.

Resolve authorizing repairs to be made on the Canada road.

\$500 appropriated for repairs on Canada road.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated for making repairs upon the Canada road, in the county of Somerset, and the land agent is hereby authorized to make the expenditure in such manner as will be for the interest of the state.

Approved February 24, 1865.

Chapter 420.

Resolve relating to printing and distributing the adjutant general's report for the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four.

Report of adjutant general, &c.

Resolved, That three thousand copies of the report of the adjutant general for eighteen hundred and sixty-four, be printed and bound in such style as the governor and council may direct.
