RICHMOND TANNERY AND BOOT AND SHOE MANUF. CO.

Name, purpose and location.

Powers and duties.

Capital stock. By-laws. R. Batchelder, their associates and successors, are hereby constituted and made a body corporate by the name of the Dunn Edge Tool Company, for the manufacture of edge tools, and of wood and timber into boxes and other articles, at Waterville and Fayette, in the county of Kennebec, with all the powers and privileges and subject to all the liabilities provided by the laws of this state concerning manufacturing corporations, and are hereby authorized to purchase and hold real and personal estate, not exceeding in value, at any one time, the sum of three hundred and fifty thousand dollars. And said corporation may establish such by-laws as they shall deem suitable to carry into effect the purposes and interests of the corporation, not repugnant to the laws of the state.

Chapter 78.

An act to incorporate the Richmond Tannery and Boot and Shoe Manufacturing Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. C. H. T. J. Southard, Samuel Toothaker, T. J. Southard, C. B. Foster, B. F. Tolman, Augustus Gaubert, Levi Musterd, Wm. H. Sturtivant, James Carney, with their associates and successors, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate by the name of the Richmond Tannery and Boot and Shoe Manufacturing Company, with a capital stock of fifty thousand dollars, divided into shares of one hundred dollars each, with power to increase the capital stock to one hundred thousand dollars by a vote of the stockholders representing two thirds of the stock, and they are hereby authorized to purchase and hold, real and personal estate to the amount of their capital stock, for the purpose of tanning hides and manufacturing boots and shoes in the town of Richmond, in Sagadahoc county, and shall have all the powers and privileges and be subject to all the duties and requirements expressed in the laws of this state relating to manufacturing corporations.

SECT. 2. Any two of the persons named in this act may call the first meeting of said corporation by giving written notice to each of the corporators at least five days prior to the time of said meeting.
