CHAP. 94.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect on its approval by the governor.

### Chapter 94.

An act to make valid the doings of the town of Machias.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. The acts and doings of the town of Machias at a meeting held in March, eighteen hundred and sixty-five, wherein the town voted to pay one hundred dollars to volunteers who enlisted in the military service of the United States in eighteen hundred and sixty-one, are hereby made valid.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect on its approval by the governor.

Soudan of Bangor, shall be allowed to take name of Drusilla A. Flanders, and her daughter, Presilla J. Soudan, shall be allowed to take the name of Presilla J. Flanders ; Hannah Frances Lane shall be allowed to take the name Annie Frankie Hodgdon ; Elizabeth P. Savage of Solon, shall be allowed to take the name of Elizabeth P. Wilson ; Myrta Adelaide Rollins of Solon, shall be allowed to take the name of Myrta Adelaide Langley ; Lewellyn A. Rich of Harrison, shall be allowed to take the name of Lewellyn Ambrose Trafton ; Waterborough B. Fisher of Lewiston, shall be allowed to take the name of Waterborough Fisher Collins ; Storer S. Graffam of Westbrook, shall be allowed to take name of Storer S. Knight ; Anne Elizabeth Steinorth of Portland, shall be allowed to take name of Anne Elizabeth White ; Prentiss N. Black of Limington, shall be allowed

CHAP. 96. to take the name of Prentiss N. Chick; Mahala C. Holt of Augusta, shall be allowed to take the name of Mahala C. Boynton; Edward K. Stevens of Montville, shall be allowed to take the name of Edgar Forrest.

### Chapter 96.

An act to incorporate the Swan Creek Union Oil and Mining Company of Ohio.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

- Corporators.**      **SECT. 1.** Frederic Robie, Jeremiah M. Mason, Samuel Hanson, Charles H. Doughty, Cyrus Greene, Alpheus S. C. Hall, Thomas Hancock, Louis G. Lougee, Peter R. Hall, William Huse and Franklin Sawyer, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate by the name of the Swan Creek Union Oil and Mining Company of Ohio, with power to adopt a common seal, to sue and be sued, to acquire and hold real and personal estate, and to lease, sell and convert, or otherwise dispose of the same; to adopt a code of by-laws, not inconsistent with the laws of this state, and to do and perform such other acts and things as may be necessary for the successful prosecution of the business of said corporation.
- Corporate name and powers.**
- Capital.**          **SECT. 2.** The capital stock of said corporation shall consist of twenty-five thousand shares of the par value of ten dollars for each share.
- First meeting.**    **SECT. 3.** The first meeting of said corporation for the choice of officers, may be called to be held at Portland by any three of the persons named in this act, by giving notice ten days before the day of said meeting; and until such officers are thus chosen the powers of said corporation may be exercised by the seven persons first named, who may, for the time being, act as directors of said company, and a majority of whom shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
- Corporators may for time being act as directors.**
- SECT. 4.** This act shall be in force from and after its approval by the governor.
