Chapter 148.

Снар. 148.

An act to change the name of the Milford and Princeton Turnpike.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The Milford and Princeton Turnpike shall hereafter be called and Granger Turnpike, known as the Granger Turnpike.

Chapter 149.

An act to enable the city of Bangor to receive and hold certain trust funds.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The city of Bangor is hereby authorized to receive in Free library its corporate capacity, hold, manage, apply, expend or invest, any donation, devise or bequest, for the establishment, increase or to same. maintenance of a free public library therein, and for any literary, scientific or charitable purposes; provided however, that the whole Proviso. amount held at any one time by said city under this act, shall not exceed one hundred thousand dollars.

and powers of city in relation

Each donation, devise and bequest received by said city conditions. under and by virtue of the preceding section, shall be held, appropriated, expended or invested, and if invested, the income thereof appropriated in such manner and for such purposes as the donor thereof shall, at the time of making said donation, devise or bequest, direct.

SECT. 3. The powers hereinbefore granted to said city may be City council. exercised by the city council of said city, in any manner they may prescribe, and by the agency of persons to whom they may delegate the same.

Sect. 4. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 150.

An act to amend chapter three hundred eighty-nine of the private laws of eighteen hundred and sixty.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The first section of said act is hereby amended by Name changed. striking out in the fifth line thereof the words "New England
