Chapter 28.

Снар. 28.

Resolve in regard to cattle diseases.

Resolved. That the governor be and hereby is authorized and requested to open a correspondence with the proper authorities in the British provinces, with a view of securing greater immunity from the cattle plague, now prevailing in Europe.

Governor to open correspondence with British provinces.

Approved February 19, 1866.

Chapter 29.

Resolve in relation to exchanging state documents with the provinces of New Brunswick and Nova Scotia.

Resolved. That the secretary of state be and he is hereby authorized and required, if practicable, to cause exchanges to be made with the governments of New Brunswick and Nova Scotia, of full sets of law reports of this state, in the same manner as is effected with the several states of the Union.

Sceretary of state to make exchanges.

Chapter 30.

Resolve in aid of building a bridge over Dead river in the county of Somerset.

Resolved, That the sum of six hundred dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated in aid of building a bridge over Dead river upon the road located in townships numbered four, range three, and four range four, in the county of Somerset; provided said Provise. bridge shall be completed to the satisfaction of the land agent by the inhabitants residing upon said road before the sum shall be paid by the state.

Chapter 31.

Resolve in favor of the insane hospital.

Resolved, That there be appropriated and paid out of the state treasury, the sum of thirty-one thousand five hundred dollars, to be expended under the superintendence and direction of the trustees of the insane hospital, for completing and furnishing the new
