Chapter 58.**CHAP. 58.**

Resolve in favor of Penobscot tribe of Indians.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury to the agent of the Penobscot tribe of Indians, the sum of four thousand four hundred and thirty dollars, to be appropriated for the benefit of said tribe, as follows:—two hundred and fifty dollars shall be expended for schools, as follows: one hundred and twenty-five dollars on Oldtown island under the supervision of the superintending school committee of Oldtown; seventy-five dollars on Mattanawcook island under the supervision of the superintending school committee of Lincoln; and fifty dollars on Olamon island, under the supervision of the superintending school committee of Greenbush; and said committees are required to report as directed by resolve approved March seventeenth, eighteen hundred and sixty. One thousand dollars shall be expended for agricultural purposes; four hundred dollars for bounties on crops; three hundred dollars salary for the agent of said tribe for the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six; two thousand dollars for annuities; fifty dollars for salary of governor of said tribe; thirty dollars for lieutenant governor, and four hundred dollars for the purpose of building a school house on Oldtown island.

Appropriation to be expended under direction of agent.

Chapter 59.

Resolve in favor of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians.

Resolved, That there be paid from the treasury of the state to the agent of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians, under the direction of the governor and council, the sum of two thousand three hundred and thirty dollars; to be by him expended for the benefit of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians, as follows:—four hundred dollars for May dividend; three hundred for November dividend; three hundred for distressed poor. The foregoing sums to be paid out of the interest accruing upon the funds belonging to said tribe. Three hundred dollars for agent's salary; five hundred dollars for agricultural purposes; three hundred dollars for bounty on crops, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six; fifty dollars for the purchase of wood at Pleasant point; fifty dollars for salary of governor and thirty dollars for lieutenant governor of said tribe; fifty dollars for plowing at Pleasant point; and fifty dollars for plowing at Peter Deny's point.
